- Cum. Overall science 3.2
- o 1,000 hours of patient care experience at time of application
 - Partially responsible for a patient
 - Work closely with, directly care for, and monitor patients
 - Does not count scribe or pharmacy tech
 - Accept patient care from as far back as you have it
- 3-5 letters of recommendation
 - One has to be someone who has worked with you in a healthcare setting
- Casper skills test
- Shadowing
 - Not required, but highly recommended!
 - Want to see everything, even other than PA
 - Average is 10-40 hours
- Not rolling admissions
- Applying to sites
 - Can apply for two sites (such as Wausau and Madison or dual degree)
 - They decide where you go
 - Only interview at one
 - Distance programs and dual degree have far less applicants
- Competitive Applicants
 - Strong academics GPA, trends
 - Relevant patient care experience
 - Well written essays
 - Answer the prompt
 - Tell us about the applicant as a person
 - Strong letters of recommendation
 - Speak both personally and professionally to the applicant

 - Health Care Experience
 - Score 1-5 for quality
 - Higher hour requirement for certification is ranked higher, such as FMT
 - Highest would be a bachelor's degree such as RN or AT
 - Potential to Stay in the Area
 - o Rigor of Undergraduate Education

 - o No minimum, most applications have at least 1000+ hours
 - Accept scribe
